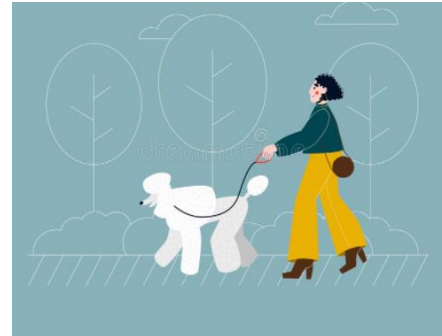


## Crime Story
